MOODLE UPGRADE COMPLETE

On April 27th, 2024, Moodle Logins were changed from using Banner IDs to KPU-issued emails.

This resulted in the following changes for faculty:

- Faculty have new accounts generated in Moodle
- All Banner created courses have remained linked to the appropriate accounts
- Manually created courses, such as community and development sites, are not immediately linked to the new accounts
- · Students can seamlessly log into Moodle using their email accounts
- Important: This change has also temporarily removed access to faculty's Kaltura media content within Moodle
