| May 2021 | Faculty Guide for International Student Success | To be completed by December 15, 2021 | We intend to create and distribute a guide to help instructors in the Faculty of Arts provide a fair, equitable, anti-racist, and inclusive learning environment for International Students. | \$1,300 |
| May 2021 | Indigenous Teaching Resources: Students' Collection | May – July 2021 | During the Spring EDUC 4210 (Best Practices in Education) the students had an assignment to analyze Indigenous Learning Resources. The students analyzed these resources and demonstrated how they could use them in diverse educational context. With some editing/formatting these could turn into a valuable resource for all KPU faculty and students. Being considered is either libguide or pressbook. The collection would add to the Indigenous learning resources offered by KPU as well as model how to integrate Indigenous education within KPU course. | May 2021 | KDocsFF Presents "Emergence" | October 11, 2021 | Set to coincide with Canada's National Coming Out Day on October 11th, KDocsFF Presents Emergence will be the premier KPU screening of Alex Sangha's documentary co-presented by KDocsFF Outreach and the Department of Asian Studies. Sangha's feature film follows three coming out narratives in Surrey's South Asian community, capturing the cultural taboos, family struggles, and transformative power of acceptance. The event will include a keynote address, a screening, and a moderated panel discussion/Q&A (featuring activists, faculty, and students connected to the transgender community). | \$1,300 |
