1. Call to Order and Territorial Acknowledgement

The Chair, Jennifer Williams, called the meeting to order at 10:02 am.

2. Approval of Agenda

Erin Ashenhurst moved the agenda be confirmed as circulated.

The motion carried.

3. Approval of Minutes, November 15, 2023

A capitalization error was noticed on page 2 of the meeting minutes: in the second paragraph under agenda item 4.3, 'the Learning Centre' should be corrected to 'The Learning Centre.' This correction was acknowledged and recommended for amendment.

Chris Burns moved the minutes be accepted as amended.

The motion carried.

4. Chair's Report

The Chair started the meeting by encouraging members to reach out with any questions, concerns, or suggestions between meetings, as she has recently assumed her role as chair. She also confirmed that, with prior notice to the committee, the library Student Ambassadors can attend the committee meetings as observers.

5. University Librarian's Report

Todd Mundle, University Librarian, presented highlights from his written report. He was pleased to inform the committee that the University will host the <u>Workshop for Instruction in Library Use</u> (WILU), Canada's premier conference on information literacy and library instruction, from May 15th to 17th, 2024, at the Richmond campus. Additionally, Todd provided the committee with a positive overview of the budget situation, addressing funding for staffing requests, capital items, and extended exam hours for both the spring and summer terms.

6. Items for discussion

6.1. Strategic Plan Update

Todd Mundle will provide the group with a final report in May.

6.2. Update on Committee Membership

In continuation of the discussions from the last meeting, Senate Vice-Chair Catherine Schwichtenberg revisited past minutes and consulted with the AVP, Teaching and Learning. She provided an update on the suggestion to replace the non-voting member position currently held by the Representative, Open Education, with a non-voting member position for the Representative, Teaching and Learning Commons. After deliberation, the committee mutually recommended that the Open Education position remains unchanged. The committee will review the full mandate and membership in the fall.

6.3. Library Hours - Student Request

Todd Mundle reported that one of the student representatives on the Board of Governors, Ishant Goyal, requested an extension of hours on weekends and on Friday nights. The Library is considering the possibility of implementing extended or more unified hours for the fall semester and assessing the cost implications of these changes.

7. Adjournment

The Chair informed the committee that she and the Vice-Chair will both be on vacation in May; she expressed her gratitude to Catherine, who has kindly agreed to chair the next meeting on May 8th.

The meeting adjourned at 10:36 a.m.
