I recently attended a conference presentation that challenged the audience to consider why we do what we do. Sounds simple, right? I don't mean answers like it's my job, I'm passionate about my discipline, teaching is rewarding, or it's my calling; I'm talking about deeply considering your values and the mark that you hope to leave on your students, colleagues and in the education system as a whole. I challenge you to dig deeply on this question as a means to consider if your values drive your pedagogy.

What are your pedagogical values? One way to identify your values is to think about what teaching choices others make that frustrate you. Another way is to consider what values you hope to promote through your teaching. You could also think about the times where you feel like the lesson, your delivery or the

approach just felt "right". The reason for this question is that if you are clear about your purpose and your values, these become the parameters with which you make instructional design decisions, technology choices and by which to select your professional development.

I have spent some time considering my own values and how they impact my choices as an educator and as a leader. My core values have been shaped by my career as a nurse and through some amazing mentors who helped me recognize my strengths and learn each step along my leadership journey. Feel free to check them out in my **eportfolio**. I see them at play in my daily behaviors, how I make decisions, and how I teach. They make the value proposition clear for doing things that may at first glance seem unpleasant or insurmountable, and yet worth moving forward. I have learned that when I am stressed or perceive conflict, often there is a rub between two or more of my values or between mine and someone else's. This awareness helps me make mindful choices. I hope you too will find it useful to consider where you see your values at play and adjust your decisions accordingly. Happy soul searching.

#### What's new in Kaltura?

Kaltura Collaboration: Media owners can add other Kaltura users as co-editors, co-publishers, and co-viewers to their media. Adding collaborators to your media allows others to edit, manage, or publish your media. As the media owner, you can add collaborators and change permissions at any time.

Please note that only those who are logged into KPU Mediaspace (media.kpu.ca) or Moodle before can be added as collaborators.



Download media: Once you enable the download feature, your media can be downloaded as an .mp4 file by students or instructors in the same Moodle course, or by anyone (including non-KPU users) who has access to the media on media.kpu.ca. This is especially useful for those who want to share the ability for others to download a copy of the video and reproduce it easily.
