Longtime KPU welding instructor Al Sumal recognized for teaching excellence Contributed by Trades & Technology



Congratulations to AI Azadwinder Singh Sumal, the Chair of the Welding and Metal Fabrication department in KPU's Faculty of Trades and Technology. Sumal has been welding for more than 45 years, educating generations of welders at KPU. He was named the 2018 Howard E. Adkins Memorial Instructor Membership Award recipient by the American Welding Society, which recognizes outstanding teaching accomplishments from across North America. He is the first B.C. recipient to receive the award.

Over his career, Sumal has created programs that assist underrepresented groups to explore possible welding careers. This includes attending and promoting welding at various events, but also developing programs for women, First Nations, refugees and underprivileged youth in India. Reflections on the BC Campus Festival of Learning Conference

National Survey of Online and Digital Learning

KPU has recently contributed to the 2018 National Online and Digital Learning Survey. This survey is operated by the Canadian Digital Learning Research Association (CDLRA), a federally incorporated not-for-profit organization. The National Survey is supported in higher education jurisdictions across Canada including eCampus agencies in various provinces, along with sector organizations such as CiCAN.

The goal of this online survey is to provide a comprehensive and reliable overview of online and digital learning in Canadian post-secondary education. The first National Survey was launched in 2017, with invitations to 203 Canadian public post-secondary institutions. The results provided evidence that online learning has increased at a rate of 10% - 15% per annum and two-thirds of Canada's post-secondary institutions view online learning as very or extremely important to their future plans. An update on KPU's Zed Cred initiative

For several years, KPU has been the leading institutional adopter of open textbooks and other open educational resources (OER). Last November we built on this momentum and launched Canada's first Zed Cred program (see kpu.ca/zedcred). The "Zed" in Zed Cred refers to zero textbook costs by way of using OER and/or library materials, while the "Cred" means that students can complete a program and earn a credential without spending money on expensive textbooks. Our first Zed Cred was the Certificate in Arts, a flexible yet foundational 1-year program based on the completion of 30 credits of coursework.

Over the past nine months, the Zed Cred initiative has grown rapidly, from 80 sections this Spring to over 300 sections this Fall. These sections represent 191 courses from 36 departments and 5 Faculties. This Fall alone, students at KPU will save \$1 million in textbook costs!

In addition to this tremendous growth, there are three major advances to report:

- 1. Thanks to the support of our colleagues in the Office of the Registrar, the academic timetable now includes <u>a searchable field for Course</u>
 Attributes, one of which denotes sections with zero required textbook costs. This is an incredibly important step as it makes it possible for students to identify Zed Cred sections at the time of registration.
- 2. With the support of the Bookstore and the Print Shop, this summer we successfully piloted an on-campus print on demand service for open textbooks. Stay tuned for an announcement as we prepare to roll out this service campus-wide this Fall.
- 3. Most exciting of all, thanks to the immense support of the faculty in Academic & Career Preparation (ACP), KPU has just launched our (and still the country's) second Zed Cred program in the form of the Adult Graduation Diploma (equivalent to the BC grade 12 graduation diploma) and Qualifying Studies pathways in English, Math, and Science.
